## **Explore Outdoor Adventure Days**

Adventure Days aim to build confidence in young people through a range of activities and challenges. It gets young people physically active, building relationships with peers and reducing screen time. Explore Outdoor also provide lunch during these sessions and young people are encouraged to make their own lunches, as it's an opportunity to discuss healthy eating and healthy food choices.

Eye Opportunity Group sessions are held in their cottage, which is well equipped with toys, a soft play/multi-sensory room and outdoor play area. The children can enjoy tailor-made activities, including arts and crafts, music and singing, group games and outdoor play in a safe, non-threatening setting. They also offer holiday sessions at Easter and in the Summer that older siblings may join in with. Alongside activities for children, they provide a support group for carers who gain friendship from each other: a family support worker is on hand to offer advice on benefits, education, family problems etc, as well as emotional support.



# Christmas 2024 Activity Guide

## **Suffolk Holiday Activity & Food Programme**

Funded by the Department of Education, the Holiday Activity & Food (HAF) Programme enables children and young people who are eligible for free school meals to access fun and enriching activities.



The holiday activities can involve helping young people experience new activities from sports, music, dance, to art, digital creativity, culture, cooking, and gardening. As well as improving socialisation, HAF-funded activity programmes help children and young people have fun with friends during the Easter, Summer, and Christmas holiday periods.

To be eligible for a HAF place, a child must be registered as eligible for benefit-related free school meals.

Eequ is a booking portal that can automatically check a child's eligibility for a HAF activity. Those who don't qualify can still book a paid for place.

Some of our Activities Unlimited providers who serve children with higher levels of need are not hosted on Eequ. Please use the details listed for the providers within this guide to contact them directly.

Also note that not all HAF providers within Suffolk receive funding from Activities Unlimited.
