








## **Thorpe Woodlands Family Holiday Pods**

Families are supported throughout their stay by experienced staff members and have opportunities to take part in pre book activities such as cycling, canoeing, climbing, archery, high ropes etc, at an additional cost. ## Suffolk Holiday Activity & Food Programme

Funded by the Department of Education, the Holiday Activity & Food (HAF) Programme enables children and young people who are eligible for free school meals to access fun and enriching activities.



The holiday activities can involve helping young people experience new activities from sports, music, dance, to art, digital creativity, culture, cooking, and gardening. As well as improving socialisation, HAF-funded activity programmes help children and young people have fun with friends during the Easter, Summer, and Christmas holiday periods.

To be eligible for a HAF place, a child must be registered as eligible for benefit-related free school meals.

Eequ is a booking portal that can automatically check a child's eligibility for a HAF activity. Those who don't qualify can still book a paid for place.

Some of our Activities Unlimited providers who serve children with higher levels of need are not hosted on Eequ. Please use the details listed for the providers within this guide to contact them directly.

Also note that not all HAF providers within Suffolk receive funding from Activities Unlimited.
