It is staffed full-time by a teacher with a passion for ensuring all young people make progress which is relevant and appropriate for them. We also have a dedicated, and highly skilled team of HLTA's and TA's working with the children each day.

Our Wren Class is an important part of our community. Situated within the school building, we take every opportunity to integrate the children, as appropriate, with children from within the main school.

Overview

The school day for Wren Class is from 9.15am – 3.15pm. Children arrive each day by the silver gate and are met by a member of staff. Our daily routine consists of a number of collective activities together and self-directed child-initiated learning. Our collective activities include songs, stories, snacks, and games.

Within Wren we have two learning classrooms which provide space for 1:1, small group work and child-initiated learning. The children are able to access our designated outside space and an indoor quiet area. Onsite we have a woodland area in which the children will spend time.

Throughout each day we have a wide range of activities available for the children to access. These involve fine and gross motor skill activities, small world play, building and construction, and sensory based activities.

Each child also has 'target-time' daily, where we work on specific activities to support each child's individual targets. A member of staff works with each Wren to help make sure that they are making personal progress towards their own learning needs.

Wrens wear school uniform, consisting of a sky-blue polo shirt, a dark blue sweatshirt / jumper, and suitable trousers or skirt.

Our Wren children are not ordinary. In fact, they are extraordinary- in every sense.
