Description of Unit

Piper's Vale Primary Specialist Unit will cater for children with special educational needs and disabilities of reception age through to the end of Key Stage 1.

A separate secure entrance is located at the front of the school for parent/carers to drop off and collect your child/ren with direct access to the classroom door. It is located within the main school building adjacent to our early years classrooms and benefits from direct access to the main corridors and play areas. The unit also has access to a dedicated outdoor learning space. There will be both teaching and support staff present each day to lead on the teaching and learning.

<u>Overview</u>

Timing of the day:

School starts at 8.40am and finishes at 3.05pm. This may vary for some and we will adjust and review based on individual needs.

Uniform:

Our school uniform consists of a royal blue jumper or cardigan (with or without school logo), black/grey trousers or skirt, white shirt or Polo shirt and black shoes.

During the summer months, girls may wear a blue check dress and boys black/grey shorts. For physical education they will need a plain white T-Shirt or polo shirt, blue/black shorts and black plimsolls or trainers. During outdoor physical education, they will need a blue/black tracksuit or tracksuit bottoms and a blue jumper.

Day to day travel of pupils around the site:

Pupils will access dedicated outdoor areas during break and Lunchtimes. Lunch will be served either in the main dining hall or a designated quiet area.
