

EAST offer opportunities for disabled young people aged 4–25 and their carer/family member to experience sailing activities from the Suffolk Yacht Harbour base on the River Orwell. Weekend sessions run May-September and are two hours - morning sessions develop basic sailing skills in conjunction with RYA Sailability & OnBoard programmes, whilst the afternoon sessions are family leisure sailing. Family Park Cooking Days (all locations):



Spend a day outside with experienced instructors, take part in some fun outdoor activities, cook a hearty meal, then take away a food box with ingredients and recipe cards to make 5 meals to cook in the comfort of your home! These days are exclusively for families eligible for free school meals.

Explore Adventure Days (all locations):

Run during the holidays for children aged 8-12, these days are a chance to get outside, join in woodland activities and learn outdoor skills like den building. Spaces available both for paying customers and free spaces as part of the Holiday Activities and Food programme.

SEND Multi Activity Days (Stowmarket, Bury and Haverhill):

If you like outdoor adventures, why not give these multi activity days a try? Activities include wall climbing, axe throwing, making a bread oven and cooking fresh bread, with extra staff on hand for support. Participants need to be aged 8-12 and able to understand and perform the activities safely (with carer support if appropriate). Days run in June, August and October.

Sleepover Short Breaks (Lowestoft/Stowmarket/Ipswich/Bury)

Sleepover Short Breaks are exclusively for young people with learning disabilities and autism (16-24) to enjoy an overnight break with their peers filled with activities that they will enjoy, whilst offering family carers a valuable break from their caring responsibilities with the reassurance that the young person is in safe hands and having a great time.

Activities are specifically designed for young people and include things like archery, climbing, treasure hunts, beach visits, discos, karaoke, movie nights and more. Sleepover costs vary depending on level of need.

Activity Providers 2023/24

L.E.A.P.S.

Leaps: Saturday Club Location: Ipswich Support Level: 1-3

Morning sessions for 5-11 year olds and afternoon sessions for those aged 12-20. All sessions provide fun and engaging activities including Lego, cooking, crafts, sensory play and more. After assessment, staff can provide 1:1 support and administer medication. Costs vary depending on support needed.

Leaps: Out Not In Location: Ipswich Support Level: 1-3


This club supports access to activities out in the community and enables young people to access bowling, cinema, theatre, park meets, eating out and socialising with the support of carers who know them well. Costs vary depending on activity and support level required.

Leaps: Holiday Club Location: Ipswich Support Level: 1-3

LEAPS Holiday Clubs are for young people aged 5-20 and take place at Stone Lodge Academy. Activities include outdoor play, craft, cooking, air hockey and more. Leaps run a tiered support system and can provide 1:1 support and administer medication (subject to assessment). Costs vary according to support needed, HAF places available for children eligible for free school meals.

Offshoot run filmmaking workshops for young people with disabilities/additional needs and young carers. Sessions are led by people working in film/television and education, and include skills such as communication and teamwork as well as learning how to make films either behind or in front of the camera. Each term the group have an Oscars evening where they screen the films they've made to families and friends.

Saturday Socials: These clubs run throughout the year for Stars (11-25s) and Buddies (8-14s). Club users can access a range of facilities including ICT, sensory rooms, art room, skills kitchen, gardening, sports, and outings.

Holiday Clubs: Based at a special school in Ipswich, clubs run during school holidays. The two different groups: Stars (11-25s) and Buddies (8-14s) provide young people with opportunities to learn new skills and meet friends within a supportive, caring environment with experienced staff.









OUT LOUD Out Loud Music

Wikid Music and iRock have joined up to create 'The iRock Social' - a day of activities for young people with additional needs aged 8-18. Morning sessions start with music and percussion workshops from Wikid, with gaming, podcasting and video sessions in the afternoons from iRock. The day aims to create a fun, safe and social environment where young people with disabilities can not only learn new skills but socialise within a group, work on projects together and create networks and friendships which can carry on outside of sessions.
