


Thorpe Woodlands

Outdoors includes a sunken trampoline and outdoor classroom. Children are always offered a variety of different sensory activities, messy play, arts and crafts. It is a chance to be independent, make friendships and have a break from their usual routines.

Tiny Topcats provides a session for children aged 0 to 5 years and their carers/siblings to come along to Topcats and access the bespoke facilities, including soft play area, interactive floor projector, a sensory room, indoor swing and outside area. It is a chance to make friends and socialise in a safe place suited to their needs. It is an opportunity for parents/carers to meet others and become familiar with Topcats staff and what is offered.

Holiday Clubs

Location: Lowestoft Support Level: 2–4 Age Group: 5–18

Holiday club is open 10 weeks of the year offering children/young people a variety of onsite activities. Topcats has an accessible kitchen/dining area where cooking and craft can take place, a sensory room with interactive floor projector, soft play area, indoor swing, music room, and spacious outside area with outdoor classroom, sunken trampoline, sensory arbour and polytunnel where they grow their own produce. They also have activities such as bingo, karaoke and discos.

Suffolk Holiday Activity & Food Programme

Funded by the Department of Education, the Holiday Activity & Food (HAF) Programme enables children and young people who are eligible for free school meals to access fun and enriching activities.



The holiday activities can involve helping young people experience new activities from sports, music, dance, to art, digital creativity, culture, cooking, and gardening. As well as improving socialisation, HAF-funded activity programmes help children and young people have fun with friends during the Easter, Summer, and Christmas holiday periods.

To be eligible for a HAF place, a child must be registered as eligible for benefit-related free school meals.

Eequ is a booking portal that can automatically check a child's eligibility for a HAF activity. Those who don't qualify can still book a paid for place.

Some of our Activities Unlimited providers who serve children with higher levels of need are not hosted on Eequ. Please use the details listed for the providers within this guide to contact them directly.

Also note that not all HAF providers within Suffolk receive funding from Activities Unlimited.
